

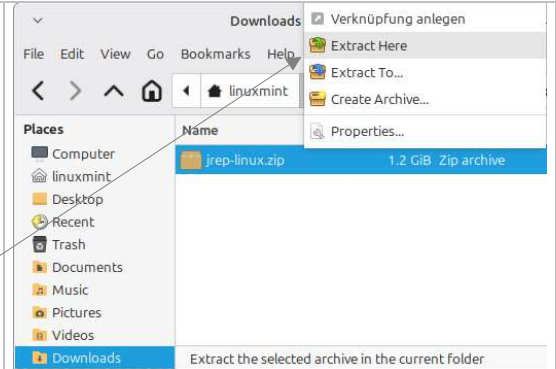
jRep-INSTALLATION for Linux

To make sure this goes smoothly, the individual steps of the process are illustrated here - but it's actually very simple and usually doesn't take very long. If you encounter difficulties with the installation at any point, please do not hesitate to contact us, with a brief description of what the problem is.

①

Click on this link www.jRep.de/jRepE-Linux.zip , or enter it into the browser

Afterwards, the downloaded file should be located in our **Downloads** folder, which we can find in the Thunar file manager:

Right-click the downloaded file.

A context menu opens; click **Extract Here** at the bottom. The files will be extracted after a short time.

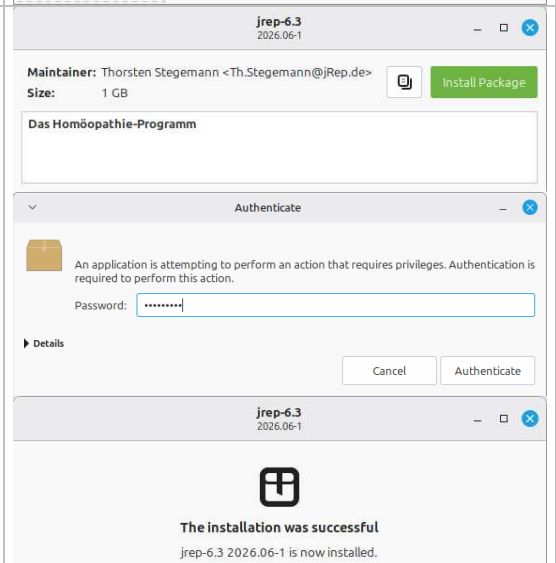
You can then delete jrep-linux.zip.

Double-click the extracted folder, **jrep-linux**, to open it:

Now we can simply install jRep by **double-clicking on jRep.deb**. After a brief moment, we can click on **Install Package**



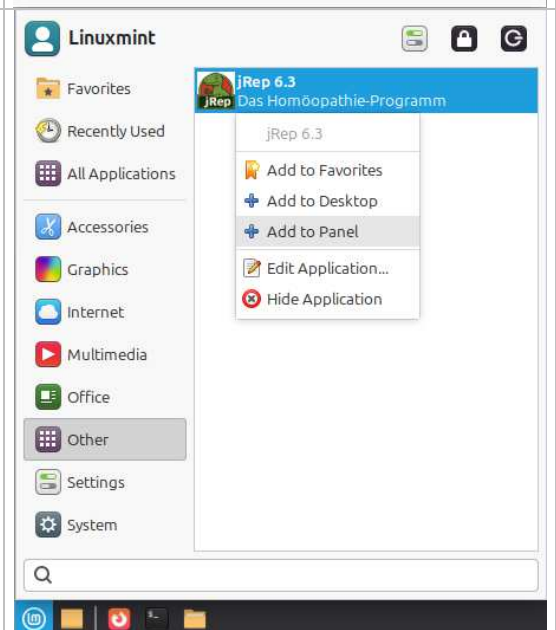
Next, we need to **enter our password** and **click on Authenticate**:

After a short time, this message should appear:

Next, we launch jRep from the **Start menu** using the shortcut located in the **Other** folder

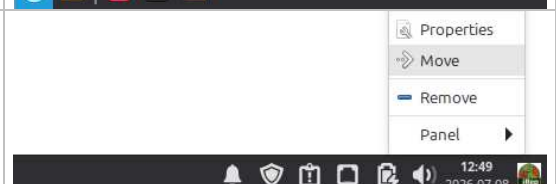
By right-clicking this shortcut, we can also easily create a shortcut on the desktop and/or in the taskbar.

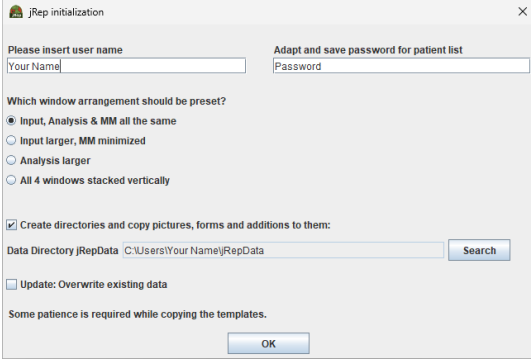
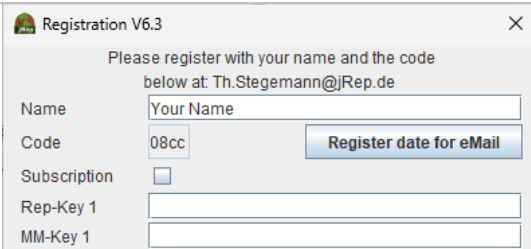
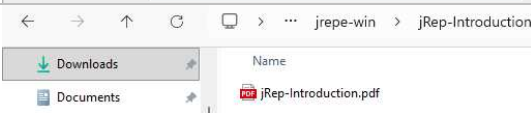

The icon appears on the far right of the taskbar.

Here, too, we right-click it and select 'Move' from the context menu. We can then move the icon to the left-hand area:



When you first start the program up this dialogue box will appear: Enter your name making sure there are no spaces after it. A random password will be created to allow access to the patient list. You can write this down or create your own. Then we can select which window arrangement the program should start with. You should only change the default jRep data directory (jRepData) if you want to save the analyses, etc., centrally on a server or in the documents folder if this is backed up. Then you create a jRepData folder on the server or in documents. Then click 'Search', select the folder and click 'Open'. For an update click 'Overwrite existing data' (If you have made changes to the repertories then back up your jRepData directory FIRST and contact me!) Then click OK	 The image shows the 'jRep initialization' dialog box. It can take a moment until jRep starts up, as the external additional repertories and questionnaires, etc., are now being copied into our jRep data directory: jRepData. When the program is started up for the first time, the instructions window will also open, which you can close with the ESC key or via the  top right corner and reopen if necessary via the 'Help - Instructions...' menu.	
If the program doesn't fill the entire screen, you can resize the outer frame by holding down the left mouse button or maximize the program window using the second icon in the top right  If the windows have moved later, you can restore the internal windows default settings via the 'Window - Arrange All' menu or with ctrl+G. To do this hold down the ctrl key (ctrl stands for control) in the bottom left corner of the keyboard and then press the G key. You can then release the keys again.	
jRep can be used indefinitely with the Pneumonia Module, etc. If you wish to test or purchase other modules, please navigate to the Registration via the Help menu and click on Register Data for Email This copies the data to your clipboard, allowing you to paste it into an email using ctrl+V and send it to me.
